With his help, the community's attitude toward Ongeira improved. What seemed impossible became hopeful.

### SUTTON, UNITED KINGDOM

he Sutton Connect Mission Project started with a vision to create a church plant that met people's needs and equipped members to serve the community. Like many areas, Sutton has residents in need of resources. Also, 32.3 percent of its population had no religious affiliation. This posed an opportunity to build connections and share God's love.


The Global Mission pioneers working with this church plant began with a food hub supported by local charities and businesses. They distribute approximately 1 ton of food to 350 families weekly and provide services such as counseling, fitness classes, cooking classes, tutoring, and more. They also run children's breakfast clubs and have started a community choir.

The food hub has become a place where friendships grow and trust builds. Community members have become volunteers. Helen, inspired by the vision, started coordinating food deliveries at the hub and now attends church regularly.

Another local volunteer, Elizabeth, experienced so much love and compassion while collecting food parcels that she now attends church with her family and wants to be involved with the mission.

n Hsinchu, Taiwan, the Hsinchu church plant started a public campus ministry. The church is near two large universities, Tsinghua University and National Chiao Tung University. This prime spot helps the church connect with many young people.

To engage with students, the church created a Korean club due to the rising popularity of Korean culture. The club was officially recognized by Tsinghua University. Some regular participants have joined the church's Friday Night Fellowship class and become members of the Seventh-day Adventist Church.

One student, Yating, joined the club after her mother passed from cancer. She enjoyed attending and found comfort there. Eventually, Yating decided to be baptized. Initially, she hesitated because she feared her family's concerns, but through prayer, everything was resolved. Now, she actively shares the gospel.
